Potential confirmed Plans for 2023 are:

- Inbound Domestic Birmingham Alabama to Santa Barbara January 2023.
- I have notified FFI about this change from 2022 to 2023.

FFI has notified me that due to the ongoing impact of the pandemic, the 2023 Journey assignment process will be a little different than usual.

1. To account for the uncertainty of travel and border closures, FFI will be undertaking the Journey assignments process later in the year. This will help FFI to have a better idea of what travel in 2023 will look like. They will also have a better idea of how many journeys will actually go ahead in 2022.

2. Clubs will have the opportunity to ask FFI to reassign an already established Journey to 2023 if they wish. This is for clubs that have a Journey already planned and ready to go when normal travel resumes. FFI expects that only a few Journeys will fit this category. A separate form will be used to make this request. This means we will need to be patient as we plan for the future.

I want to say that it has been an interesting and unusual two years during my term as president. I thank my fellow officers, and the active committee members who have made my task easier and indeed possible.

OPEN WORLD

Open World is a program designed and promoted by the U. S. Library of Congress. Friendship Force International is just one of approximately 20 organizations who agree to participate and host and provide 32 hours of education, interaction and experiences that follow a specific theme. This presentation had all the nuts and bolts of the program to encourage FFSB interest in thinking about what our club might have to offer within our community as it relates to specific themes. There are a small number of delegates, 5-6, a coordinator and an interpreter, if needed. The U.S. Library of Congress pays a stipend per delegate. It is to be used, if FFSB decided to proceed, on the program developed, meals, sightseeing, museums, etc.

The following is taken from the slideshow presentation.

What is the Open World Leadership Program?

- A exchange program which brings young, dynamic political and civic leaders from countries around the world to the US for short professional programming to give them first-hand exposure to American cultural, government and democracy.
- Mostly from former Soviet countries such as Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, Kazakhstan, and Balkan countries such as Serbia, Kosovo and North Macedonia
- Friendship force first received a grant in 1999 and since then has hosted over 2,500 delegates

Why FF works with Open World (OW)?

- FF's mission is to promote global understanding across the barriers that separate people.
- OW's mission is very similar
- OW gives clubs the opportunity to share global perspectives and reinforce the notion that peace and national security can be achieved through citizen diplomacy and cultural exchanges.

How different from a journey?

- US clubs only
- Delegates are young professionals or emerging leaders
- Professionally-focused around a theme
- Visa is guaranteed
- Must follow grant requirements
- Smaller group so need less home hosts.

Look and Feel

- 5 delegates, 1 facilitator and 1 interpreter
- Delegates have introduction to US in Washington, DC
- Eight day stay with host club
- 32 hours total professional programming on the theme
e.g educational presentations, personal interaction with American counterparts in their fields and visits with government representatives

How are Topics Chosen

- Open World decides by Country the topics of the year
- Try to send a delegation to each state each year
- Members of Congress have input- especially members of appropriations committee

N. Macedonia	Members of Parliament

. Praticalities

- Develop detailed programing for the week and submit to OW for approval – be flexible
- Develop a budget
- The clubs OW budget gets funds based on generous grant from OW
 - Grant usually \$5,000 to \$6,000
 - Provide group meals, van rentals, ect
- Keep detailed records on spending and in-kind donations (host meals, nights, mileage)
- Engage the press
- Complete a detailed report afterward to OW
